GRE Test Prep Course Spring 2013

Class Format

The fall session of the GRE prep course meets Thursday evenings throughout the semester. Students will be prepared to write the GRE at the end of the course, and are advised to book a test date in late January or February.

60 minutes - Quantitative Reasoning

30 minutes - Verbal Reasoning

30 minutes – Analytical Writing

Although we will adhere to the schedule as closely as possible, each session will be tailored to the needs of the participants, who are therefore strongly encouraged to plan on attending each class in its entirety.

FAQ's

Do I need to take the GRE?

The vast majority of graduate programs require GRE scores as part of the application process.

When should I take the GRE?

Students planning to apply to graduate programs are strongly advised to take the GRE before the beginning of their senior year. Many programs have application deadlines in the late fall, however some are earlier and programs with rolling admissions often begin considering applications as early as September 1. Students should check the application deadlines for their program(s) of interest.

Should I take the GRE prep course or study on my own?

If you are unsure about whether the course is right for you, Mrs. Cohen is available to discuss your options with you.

What material does the GRE prep course cover?

We will focus on the material tested in the quantitative (math) and verbal (language) sections of the test. The test content will be reviewed and numerous practice questions will be covered. We will prepare for the analytical writing portion of the GRE using the Power Writing model. We will also cover general test taking information and tips, test format and question types, how to use the online GRE prep materials and how to take the computer based test.

Is there homework?

In addition to class time, students should expect to spend time preparing on their own between classes. The amount of time will vary from student to student. Homework will be assigned following each class and will consist primarily of practice questions.

Will taking the course totally prepare me to take the GRE?

Students who attend all classes and complete the assigned homework will be well prepared to take the GRE.

How do I register for the GRE?

Information and guidance on the registration process will be provided in class. However, students are responsible for registering for the GRE.

Where do I take the GRE?

When will I get my scores?

Test scores are available 10-15 days after the test is taken and will be reported directly to each student. Students are responsible for determining whether this time frame meets the deadline(s) for any graduate programs of interest.
